Compulsory REVISION comments	The paper presents an innovative proposal for the treatment of bacterial infections, through conjugates of Streptococcus of serum antibody and amikacin sulfate. The paper is interesting but needs to be more detailed. Antibody-drug conjugates (ADC) has been tested in the treatment of Cancer, and I did not see references about this approach to treat bacteria infections in the present article, so this lack of studies about ADC in bacteria should be highlighted in the article, and the article also should cite Cancer as a reference for this	

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	innovative proposal.  First, the Streptococcus specie needs to be specified. In Cancer, the antibody production is monoclonal. The antibody production is not specific to an antigen of Streptococcus in this article. Authors use all rabbit antisera. Why it happen?  Were the rabbits germ free? How do you ensure that the antibody are specific to Streptococcus surface and not to a exotoxin produced by the bacteria?  In Figure 3 only the conjugates are stained? How can I see the conjugate specificity? It needs to be explained.	
Minor REVISION comments	The first part of the Introduction needs to be referenced. In Discusion, the mechanism of antibody targeting in vitro needs to be referenced.
