Survival or Excellence?</p>	<p>The meaning of climate into this paper has been explained in different dimensions or angles. Here we are NOT talking about the climate as WEATHER, the climate as weather can be described as HOT or COLD as related to temperature, pressure and wind e.t.c. But the climate under this study is the working climate.
