Please consider changing it to something like 'Our Experience....' or 'A study of....'</p> <p>Abstract: 1) Please mention background / introduction (at least 2 – 3 lines) before the aims and objectives</p> <p>Introduction: 1) Paragraph 3 – in theories of endometriosis, metastatic theory is wrongly described as retrograde menstruation. Retrograde menstruation is Samson's Theory whereas Halban's is metastatic or haematogenous / lymphatic spread</p> <p>Results: 1) Please consider to direct the text towards the table (eg: instead of mentioning Table 1. it is advisable to mention, 'the same is illustrated / highlighted / shown / tabulated / described in table 1.</p>	<p>-Topic changed to: ENDOMETRIOSIS: A CLINICOPATHOLOGICAL STUDY</p> <p>-This correction is effected as suggested</p> <p>-No such wrong description was seen.
