Evidence indicates that high health literacy level in mothers is also important to improve pregnancy outcomes. When mothers are literate and educated, the more likely they are to use a health facility during pregnancy to receive prenatal care services. While deficiency in MHL have often negatively influences their children's health. Limited MHL contributes to substantial increases in morbidity and mortality in mothers and newborns.
