Their findings are interesting, however seem preliminary and somewhat anecdotal. This is due largely to the small sample size, the skew towards male infants and the fact that mothers in this study who give birth to smaller babies are shorter and lighter individuals themselves. The study as is can therefore not be accepted for publication. | |
