<u>Compulsory</u> REVISION comments	<ol> <li>The theme dealt here is important. I have some advice.</li> <li>Abstract should be self-explanatory. One cannot understand that O blood type is more likely to be associated with pylori infection in the Abstract. State the data more definitely in a reader-friendly manner.</li> <li>State "statistics" used. Package name does not indicate statistics method.</li> <li>Table 1 is not needed.</li> <li>In introduction, please delete all parts explaining ABO type, which is common knowledge of doctors. Please reduce Introduction by 1/2.</li> <li>Number of pylori (-) cases is very small. Thus, comparing pylori + vs. – group does not make sense. You can state it in a supplementary manner. But, you hade better compare pylori + (in this study) vs. general population in your area (based on ten-thousands or a million if your country has such data). Comparing between 103 vs. 17! Makes no sense.</li> </ol>
