- There are lots of spelling mistakes (typographical errors). Line 8: surrouned (surrounded), embedded (embedded), Line 9: attemting (attempting), Line 13: laproscopy (laparoscopy), Line 16: peforated (perforated), Line18: minilaprotomy (mini-laparotomy), Line 38: laproscopic ligation (laparoscopic ligation), Line 54: pomeroy's (Pomeroy's), Line 81: diarrhea (diarrhoea), Line 92: Aknowledgement (Acknowledgement).
- 2. This case report should contain the name of the city (town) and country where this procedure was carried out in the case report section of the manuscript. The authors should not say in a government hospital only. The city (town) should also appear in the key words please.
- 3. The keywords should be: perforation, contraception, copper T, city(town)
- A lot of double spaces appeared in between words: Line 30/31 recurrent..urinary tract infection, Line 32: symptomatic.., Line 38: All..her, Line 48: laparoscopy,..cu T, Line 51: Supra pubic..3-5cm, Line 52: left..cornu, Line 55: and..injectable, Line 56: day 7.., Line76: symptoms,..it is, Line 82: removed..immediately, Line 84: potentially..had, Line 87: our..patient.
