

The stated objective of this manuscript is to describe a comparative study on tick borne haemoparasites of cattle and goats slaughtered in Makurdi, Nigeria abattoirs. Though the information provided is interesting, the results do not accurately reflect the stated objective. The paper as it stands is not suitable for the readership of the journal. The manuscript suffers from the following points and thus I think a major revision is required.

1. The results section is too short and should be rewritten. Poor design of the experiment was noticed.
2. The "Discussion" section should be rewritten as it seems incomplete. More discussion is needed regarding the previous studies in this field.
3. This paper needs to be substantively reconstructed to express precisely about the experiments done and the results obtained in a simple scientific manner. The language of this section is unsatisfactory. Check for the grammar errors.
4. The percentage of the examined three breed cattle and four goats should be mentioned in "Materials & Methods" section.
5. I suggest replacing the last confused sentence reported in the "Abstract" section by the last sentence in the "Conclusion" section.
6. The percentage of haemoparasites data of cattle and goats (reported in the "Abstract" section) do not match with the corresponding data reported in the "Results" section and tables.
7. Poor design of Table 1, 2 and 3. Check the table formatting style.
8. No indication about Table 1, 2 & 3 in the text of the "Results" section.
9. Genus and species should be written in italics.
