<p>The authors have addressed some of the comments given but still the following must be done:</p> <p>Text in section 2.2 is mostly taken from the article Different Type Network Security Threats and Solutions, A Review (IPASJ International Journal of Computer Science (IJCS), 2017), so this reference must be added.</p> <p>Adequate references are needed for section 2.2.1. (the current reference [4] is not ok since there are only 4 steps for attack mitigation and 13 in the manuscript).</p> <p>The survey method mentioned in section 3 must be better explained (was it questionnaire, type of questions, survey analysis – what network security problems are identified etc.). – the authors did not provide survey analysis (only mentioned “such as lack of secure connection with remote user, porous ports on network devices which is threat on the network”).</p> <p>Text added in section 3 (3.1.3 to 3.1.11) should be shortened since these are the well known security mechanisms and references must be added since some text is taken from other articles. Also, the text style should be improved since in some cases it is explanation of security mechanisms and in some cases (3.1.6 to 3.1.8) authors use the Imperative mood (“implement”).</p>	<p><b>Due citation and references has been added as appropriate.</b></p> <p><b>Required reference for section 2.2.1 has been added as required.</b></p> <p><b>The survey method used has been extensively explained too mean moving round the institution's ICT center and sites where the network configuration are done in a bid to carry out inspections, observation, performance analysis in view of the prevailing security challenges and interaction with various stake holders.</b></p> <p><b>The text in section 3 (3.1.3 to 3.1.11) was shorten where necessary and citations were also made as requested by the reviewer.</b></p>
