Some comments were made in order to contribute to the authors:</b></p> <p>1 - The abstract may contain some more conclusions from the paper.</p> <p>2- Keywords: Immediately after the abstract, about 4-8 keywords should be given. In the manuscript there are only 4 keywords, I suggest including "alcohol dependence".</p> <p>3 - The manuscript respects the limit of words (3.327). The manuscript respects the limit of words. However, one can use more delays in other studies, references with great impact on the subject of alcohol: Drug and Alcohol Dependence, Brazilian Journal of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Drug safety, Journal of Psychoactive Drugs, Alcohol (Fayetteville, Ny) , Alcoholism: Clinical And Experimental Research.</p> <p>4- Introduction: Write more (<b>briefly</b>) about the different types of drugs: ecstasy, solvents, marijuana, alcohol, LSD, crack, among others The problem (introduction) is significant and concisely stated. However, I suggest the use of more references, some cited by the author are relevant, but there are more recent references (with other populations), which he could use to add a greater impact to his study.</p> <p>5- The topic "Adolescent brain evolution" was very good, maybe include other references of greater impact help in the discussion of this topic.</p> <p>6- Conclusion: A clear and unique conclusion of the authors is needed. In addition, in both all topics and in the own Conclusion, the authors need to clarify their positions.</p>	<p>Many thanks for the contributions. The article was revised and some modifications were made:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The abstract was complemented.</li> <li>2. 4 additional keywords were included.</li> <li>3. More bibliographic references of human research were included.</li> <li>4-6. Some sections were modified with the inclusion of new references. The article specifically explores the effects of alcohol on the adolescent's brain, because alcohol is the drug of choice among teens in worldwide, with easy accessibility and the lack of legal consequences.</li> </ol> <p>All changes are highlighted in the text.</p>
