<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>I have some advice. Title is miss-spelled. "Wernicke" is right. Please be careful. Authors very rarely make such mistakes in "Title".</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Words (spell) are sometimes adhered (liken, needsuitable) each other. Please perform spellcheck using spellchecker. You sometimes use NYP instead of NVP.</li> <li>This review summarized the issue of "Wernicke encephalopathy (or Korsakoff syndrome) cause by hyperemesis gravidarum". State this meaning in title and abstract and appropriate parts.</li> <li>More than 50 references are already cited in Introduction. This is very peculiar. You wrote things (that should be written in the text) already in Introduction. Reduce the volume and references of Introduction and move them to the text itself.</li> <li>Thiamine B1: is this expression right? We use "vitamin B1".</li> <li>I advise the following. In Introduction you had better describe the followings. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>"This review mainly targets to describe Wernicke encephalopathy and Korsakoff syndrome caused by hyperemesis gravidarum. While doing so, we also touch hyperemesis gravidarum and its prevention/treatment because this issue closely associated with the present main theme."</li> <li>Usually, we consider that Wernicke encephalopathy is the initial manifestation and Korsakoff is the chronic state of this encephalopathy. Please state the relationship of these two neurological disorders (or define them).</li> </ol> </li> </ol> <p>To tell you honestly, all the description of HG should be deleted (completely extinguished) because there are already so many good review (Cochrane) regarding HG and its treatment. However, to do it requires tremendous effort for you, and, thus, I advise you that you should definitely state that you here only "add" HG treatment in this review. The main theme here is Wernicke caused by HG!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Conclusion usually consists of three sentences. Please reduce Conclusion. Do not repeat things.</li> </ol> <p>References: Some journals are written in abbreviated style and others in full spelling.</p>
