Is plagiarism.</p> <p>Almost all the introduction part is based on the work from 2008. Only one example where the phrase is identical : A large number of herdsmen rely on a range of ethno-veterinary practices to keep their livestock healthy. These traditional animal practices include the use of medicinal plants, surgical techniques and management practices to prevent and treat a wide range of diseases and problems encountered by livestock farmers [7]. 7.
